AFFIDAVIT

TERRITORY OF THE VIRGIN ISLANDS

DIVISION OF ST. THOMAS

- I, MARIO BROOKS, an adult resident of St. Thomas, U.S. Virgin Islands do hereby affirm and state as follows:
 - 1. I am employed by the Government of the Virgin Islands as Commissioner of the Virgin Islands Police Department ("GVI" or "VIPD") located at 5400 Veterans Drive St, Thomas, VI 00802.
 - 2. I have been employed with VIPD since 1994. As Commissioner, I assure you that the institution is run appropriately on a daily basis and ensure that there is sufficient staffing, scheduling, and the mandates of VIPD are being implemented.
 - 3. I have practiced in law enforcement since 1994 as a police officer. Then, I worked in supervisory roles in 2008 as a sergeant, and 2012 as a lieutenant. I have

also served in administration since 2020 as Assistant Commissioner and Commissioner of VIPD.

- 4. VIPD which is the primary law enforcement agency within the executive branch which is responsible for the safety and protection of the public.
- 5. VIPD employs approximately one hundred ten (110) police officers in the St. Thomas/St. John district who are members of the Police Benevolent Association ("PBA").
- 6. Most police officers in the VIPD St. Thomas/St. John district work in the patrol division.
- 7. Daily, VIPD St. Thomas/St. John district responds to approximately one hundred (100) calls for service, vehicle collisions, shots fired, domestic disputes, assaults, robberies and the like.
- 8. Currently, VIPD has eleven (11) police officers in mandatory annual National Guard training.
- 9. On June 15, 2025, on the island of St. Thomas, three (3) police officers were assigned to work the 8am to 6pm shift. All three called out "sick."
- 10. The VIPD was severely handicapped because the 8am to 6pm shift had three other police officers on military leave, two on annual leave and one had the day off.
- 11. On June 15, 2025, on St. John there are five police officers assigned to the 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. shift: Two called out "sick", one had the day-off, one used a vacation day and only one reported to work.

- 12. On June 15, 2025, on St. Thomas, for the 2 p.m. to 10 p.m. shift, four officers had the day off, two officers called out "sick", one officer was on vacation leave, and one on military leave.
- 13. Typically, when the patrol division is short-staffed, VIPD will reach out to police officers in specialized units to assist specifically the Criminal Investigations Bureau and the Special Operations Bureau.
- 14. However, on June 15, 2025, on the island of St. Thomas during the 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. shift, six officers in the Criminal Investigations Bureau called out "sick."
- 15. On June 15, 2025, six police officers from the Specials Operations Bureau called out "sick." The Special Operations Bureau officers were assigned to the festival village at Frenchtown during the weekend June 13-15, 2025.
- 16. Additionally, two officers from the downtown patrol assignment who were reassigned to the Frenchtown Village also called out "sick."
- 17. Consequently, there was no police officer presence at the festival, only supervisors.
- 18. Additionally, today June 16, 2025, all seven school security officers called out "sick." Consequently, they are no police officers at the Police Athletic League ("PAL") which is the VIPD summer camp and Department of Education summer school.
- 19. Moreover, VIPD responds to approximately sixty (60) vehicle collisions weekly.
- 20. On June 16, 2025, all five officers in the Traffic Investigations Bureau called out "sick."

- 21. Since the Officers of the PBA striked, the VIPD is forced to require police supervisors and peace officers in other agencies to assist in covering shifts to prevent complete catastrophe because of inadequate staffing.
- 22. Having supervisors work double shifts impacts the health and safety of the supervisor and public since it may affect the alertness of the supervisors.
- 23. This strike also financially impacts VIPD in that the agency will have to pay overtime at a higher rate for the supervisors to take the shift.
